DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is a two story, three bay German sided log structure with vertically boarded gables. A one story kitchen wing extends to the rear. It is also sided with vertical boards. Windows of the front and side walls are of uniform size with two over two pane sashes and late 19th century architraves with pointed top pieces. At the back of the house windows are quite small and irregularly placed and with very wide frames. The house has a central chimney of brick plus an inside end chimney. A newer brick flue is attached to an end wall.

A ca. 1900 frame house is located in the front of the main dwelling. The property is also said to have been a mill site. A mill stone has been used as part of the sidewalk paving for the turn of the century house.


