DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This brick house, now a commercial building with a furniture store, is a two and one half story, three bay Second Empire style building with a slate covered mansard roof.

The first story has been modernized to accommodate the building's 20th century commercial use. It is possible that the building was used commercially prior to the present renovations, however.

The second story and the mansard facade appear to be essentially original. Fenestration at the second story consists of pairs of single pane sash windows joined by a wooden mullion. The center bay contains one single pane sash window. All windows at this level have segmental arched tops.

In the mansard are three gabled dormers. The central bay projects slightly suggesting a tower.

The building would appear to date from the late 19th century.


