Justification for decision: (Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map)

Based on the available information, the Eighth Avenue Survey District does not appear to meet the National Register Criteria. Composed of two modest dwellings located at 8 and 10 Eighth Avenue, the property does not possess sufficient architectural significance to warrant inclusion under Criterion C. The dwellings were constructed in 1940 for two brothers and are nearly identical in appearance. They are similar to the cottage type residences constructed in the thousands in this area of suburban Baltimore during the World War II period. The only notable aspect of these two houses is the use of rusticated concrete block, in an area where frame predominates. The houses are located in an area of later commercial properties which would not constitute an historic district. They are located substantially north of the original platted Town of Glen Burnie and that portion of the town which is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.

This survey district includes two dwellings, 8 and 10 Eighth Avenue, NW. These dwellings are very similar in style and materials. Both are side-gabled dwellings constructed of rusticated concrete block with concrete-block, gable-end chimneys. To the left, 10 Eighth Avenue is the larger of the two. It has three gabled dormers on its southwest front elevation and a frame screened porch on its northwest side elevation. Its six-over-six windows are set singly and in groups of three, and its front door is flanked with sidelights and wood pilasters. To the right, 8 Eighth Avenue has two gabled dormers and a gabled portico, supported on fluted stone columns. Both properties are overgrown with trees and shrubbery.

According to Glen Burnie resident Audrey Dietz, these dwellings were built by two brothers in 1940. Carl Wagner built 10 Eighth Avenue and resided there with his wife Hilda, and his brother Jerome Wagner built 8 Eighth Avenue. At the time the dwellings were constructed, Eighth Avenue was a dead-end road. The Wagners owned a much larger tract at the time, but sold parcels to some of the commercial businesses that moved to the area after Dorsey Road was connected to Eighth Street in the late 1940s or early 1950s. The dwellings are presently two of the few remaining residences in the area, and both serve as rental properties. They are owned by a group of Wagner heirs, including Dietz, and are for sale.




