Based on the available information, the Glen Burnie Ice Manufacturing Company does not appear to meet the National Register Criteria for individual listing. The long, concrete block building is clearly utilitarian in character, distinguished only by a stepped gable facade and elevated front loading dock sheltered by a shed roofed canopy. The building has had a number of minor additions to the sides and rear. The Glen Burnie Ice Manufacturing Company was established in 1922 and continues to operate as an ice manufacturay. Despite the relatively high degree of integrity of the building, there is insufficient context for operations of this sort to serve as a basis for an eligibility evaluation under any of the Criteria. The design and type of the building and function of the establishment were undoubtedly extremely common at the time of construction. The property is located outside the National Register eligible section of Glen Burnie.

Contributing Resource Count: 1 building.

This concrete-block building consists of a long gable-roofed core with a number of shed- and gable-roofed additions on the sides and rear. The main elevation is formed by the building's gabled end, topped by a stepped parapet. A lower stepped parapet to the left forms the end of another gable-roofed section running parallel to the main core. A door is centered under the main parapet roof. Extending across most of the front elevation is an elevated loading dock covered by a shed-roofed canopy supported on brackets.


