Building NA73, located in the North Severn area of the US Naval Academy in Anne Arundel County, is not located within the boundaries of a National Register-eligible historic district, nor is it considered eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

Built in 1942, Building NA73 is a long, low-lying, one-story brick-clad structure originally built as a firehouse. The building is covered with a flat roof and features metal sash and wood sash windows. It currently serves as the Grounds Maintenance Offices and Equipment building and is not a particularly good example of firehouse architecture and its construction is not directly related to the primary mission of the Naval Academy. The building lacks the architectural distinctiveness necessary to qualify it for listing under Criterion C.

DESCRIPTION



The PW Maintenance Shop (Building NA73), built in 1942 according to Naval Academy North Severn documents, stands on the south side of Bullard Boulevard approximately 50 meters (150 feet) west of its intersection with West Road in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. Set amidst a former United States Naval radio installation, open grassy fields surround the building. An associated Flammable Storage Building (Building NA80) stands immediately west of the Maintenance Shop (Photo 41634-10).

Built of five-to-one common brick bond, the Maintenance Shop consists of a one-story rectangular structure with a flat roof (Photo 41634-7). Concrete copings atop the brick walls exhibit copper sheathing. A concrete foundation undergirds the entire structure. Five bays penetrate the west elevation while eight bays occupy the south elevation. A seam in the middle of the west and east elevations probably denote different construction periods or an extensive remodeling. Bricks composing the northern half of the building appear more modern and brighter than those in the southern half of the structure. An exterior brick chimney pile rises above the east elevation (Photo 41634-6).


The west and east elevations display mirror images in their three southern bays. The three bays coincide with the seam demarcating construction periods. Each elevation features a two-panel door with nine lights and a six-light transom, a vertically-rolling garage door, and a six-over-six wooden sash. The west elevation also possesses two six-light casements on the north side of the seam. The south elevation's eight bays each contain triple one-over-one metal sash. Ten bays, consisting of vertically-rolling garage doors, steel doors and industrial sash with hoppers, penetrate the north elevation of NA73. Concrete sills and soldier brick lintels ornament the openings. Some lintels span two or more openings signifying a reworking of the elevation's fenestration.

West of the Maintenance Shop lies Flammable Storage Building NA80 (Photo 41634-8). A small rectangular, one-story brick building erected in 1943, NA80 features a shallowly-sloped shed roof with exposed rafter feet. A poured concrete foundation supports the five-over-one common brick bond structure. Concrete lintels span small square ventilator openings in the west, south and east elevations (Photo 41634-9). The north elevation exhibits board-and-batten double-leaf doors.
