This site is composed of four mobile home units used for offices. All of the units rest upon concrete filled metal post foundations. On the facade ground level are wooden lathe strips which hide the foundations from view. All units are made of metal sheathing, the central unit is 5 bays wide with a center double glass and metal doorway. The front porch has double set of wooden steps, iron handrailings, and three metal posts that support a corrugated plastic awning. Three of the units have curved metal rooves except the unit at the rear which has a flat roof. All of them have metal casement windows surrounded by aluminium louvered shutters. The location of these units is at the back of the site, many new and used trucks and automobiles occupy a large portion of the property.
