Description:

The Channey/Jones Property is a commercial building on the east side of Second Street in Laurel, Prince George's County. Originally two separate 1-story residences dating from circa 1935, the buildings were joined with a 2-story central addition in 1990. The property currently exists as a 2-story, 9-bay building, with a central, side-gable building flanked by two 1-story side-gable wings. The building is covered in vinyl siding, and has a concrete foundation. The roof is covered in standing-seam metal and there is an exterior end chimney on the north end, and an exterior chimney on the west elevation of the south wing. The windows are all 1/1 double-hung vinyl.

Significance:

The Channey/Jones property was once two separate residences in the John R. Jones Subdivision. The wood-frame cottage was built in 1935 by Bessie Channey. It was located on part of lot 11 as recorded in the John R. Jones Subdivision. Bessie Channey sold the property in 1979 to the Melbourne, Feagin, and Hammersmith Insurance Agency, which the current owners also owned. The brick cottage was built in 1934 by John R. Jones on Lot 5 of the Talbott estate, which he purchased from Doris Wolf. J. Russell Jones, the son of John R. Jones, inherited the property, known as part of Lot 12 in the Jones subdivision, in 1949. He sold the property in 1971 to Percival G. Melbourne III, one of the current owners. The properties were joined in 1990 by the central addition, and the building now operates as Melbourne, Feagin, and Hammersmith Realtors.

The Channey/Jones Property is a commercial building on the east side of Second Street in Laurel, Prince George's County. Originally two separate 1-story residences dating from circa 1935, the buildings were joined with a 2-story central addition in 1990. The property currently exists as a 2-story, 9-bay building, with a central, side-gable building flanked by two 1-story side-gable wings. The building is covered in vinyl siding, and has a concrete foundation. The roof is covered in standing-seam metal and there is an exterior-end chimney on the north end, and an exterior chimney on the west elevation of the south wing. The windows are all 1/1 double-hung vinyl.

The wing on the north was originally a 1½-story, 3-bay side-gable cottage. It was of wood-frame construction, with a side-gable roof covered in asphalt shingles. There was a rear shed dormer, an exterior-end chimney, and a shed-roof porch. The entrance was centered.

The wing on the south was originally a 1-story, 3-bay side-gable cottage with a front entrance gable and chimney. It was of brick construction with a concrete foundation, and had a clipped-gable roof. The entrance was centered.

The west, or front elevation is composed of three sections. The first section is the circa 1935 frame side-gable cottage. There is a 1-story shed roof porch with turned wood supports across the front. It is currently 1½-stories tall and 3-bays wide. The entrance is centered, and is flanked by two 1/1 vinyl windows. There is a large gable-dormer which was added to an existing shed dormer in 1990. It has a band of four fixed-light windows. The second section is the 1990 addition. It is 2-stories tall and 3-bays wide. It has a side-gable roof with a central cross-gable. There is a pedimented entry porch with turned wood supports. The entrance is centered, and has an oval-light door flanked by 3-light sidelights. The entrance is flanked by 1/1 double-hung windows. The second story has four 1/1 double-hung vinyl windows. There is a semi-circular fanlight above the center two windows under the center gable. The third portion is the circa 1935 brick house. It is currently 1-story tall and 3-bays wide. The first bay has paired 1/1 windows. The second bay once contained an entrance, but now has a 1/1 double-hung window topped with a semi-circular fanlight. There is a battered brick chimney between the second and third bays. The third bay has a 1/1 double-hung vinyl window. Small gables were added above the first and third bays in 1990. The end gable is clipped.

The south elevation consists of the gable end of the brick cottage and the central addition. The first story has four bays. The first bay has paired 1/1 double-hung windows. The second bay projects, and has a clipped-gable roof. It has paired 1/1 double-hung vinyl windows. The third and fourth bays have 1/1 double-hung windows. There is a 6/1 double-hung window in the gable. The rear of the central addition has a door with a shed roof porch in the basement level and a 1/1 double-hung window. The second floor of the addition has a single 1/1 double-hung vinyl window.

The east, or rear elevation is composed of three sections. The first section is the rear of the brick cottage. It has a raised foundation with a boarded door in the basement level. There is one 1/1 double-hung window on the first story. The second section is the central addition. It

has a raised foundation. There is a door with a pedimented hood in the basement level, and two 1/1 double-hung windows. There are three 1/1 double-hung windows on the first story. The third section is the frame cottage. It has a raised foundation. There is a door and a window in the basement level. A set of steps leads to a shed-roof porch on the first story. There are paired 1/1 double-hung windows and two doors on the first story. There is a shed-roof dormer with a band of three fixed-lights.

The north elevation consists of the gable end of the frame cottage and the central addition. The frame cottage has a raised foundation. There is a fixed-light window in the basement level. There is a brick chimney between the third and fourth bays. The first bay has paired 1/1 double-hung replacement windows. There are three additional 1/1 double-hung windows on the first story. The second story has a single 1/1 double-hung window and paired 1/1 double-hung windows adjacent to the chimney. There are exposed rafters, but they have been covered with aluminum soffit and fascia.

The Channey/Jones Property is located on the east side of Second Avenue, and is surrounded by converted residential properties to the north and south, industrial properties to the east, and commercial properties to the west. There is a parking lot to the immediate east of the building. The historic setting of the property would have been a residential neighborhood in the City of Laurel.

components, such as door frames, moldings, sash and window units, and porch decoration. The development of post-Civil War machinery capable of producing large amounts of standardized housing elements, such as those found in cottages, contributed greatly to the development of the modern American housing industry. Designs for vernacular cottages were obtained from popular magazines, such as House Beautiful, or carpenter's and builder's journals, such as American Builder. A variety of front-gable, side-gable, cross-gable and hipped roof frame cottages were developed in the early to mid-twentieth century. Front-gable and hipped roof cottages are primarily 1 to 1½-stories tall, 3-bays wide and several rooms deep. Side-gable and cross-gable structures are usually 2 to 2½-stories tall, are typically 2 to 3-bays in width and vary from one to three rooms deep. They usually include a porch covered with a shed roof. Porches are supported by posts often containing machine-produced Victorian ornamentation. Some cottages feature ornamentation drawn from Craftsman style or Colonial Revival architecture (Gottfried and Jennings 1988, viii-xv).

National Register Evaluation

Constructed circa 1935 and 1990, the Channey/Jones Property is not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. The property is not eligible under Criterion A, as research conducted indicates no association with any historic events or trends significant in the development of national, state, or local history. Historic research indicates that the property has no association with persons who have made specific contributions to history, and therefore, it does not meet Criterion B. It is not eligible under Criterion C, as it has been greatly altered with the joining of two residences with a central addition, vinyl siding, new gables, and new windows. The property no longer retains integrity of materials, workmanship, design, feeling, or association. Finally, the property has no known potential to yield important information, and therefore, is not eligible under Criterion D.


