Description:

The Moran Property is a 1½-story, 3-bay side-gable vernacular cottage on the north side of Hughesville School Road in Hughesville, Charles County. Constructed in 1932, the building has an enclosed front porch and a shed-roof addition at the rear. The structure has a side-gable roof covered with asphalt shingles, a front-gable dormer, an exterior brick chimney, and an interior brick chimney. It is of wood-frame construction with vinyl siding and it has a concrete block foundation. The windows are 2/2 double-hung wood. The house has a shed roof porch, with a centered gable, on the front elevation. The porch has been enclosed; the first bay has been renovated into a bedroom, and the second and third bays are an entry and sitting area. The porch has a concrete block foundation and a full-width aluminum awning.

Significance:

Constructed in 1932, the Moran Property is an undistinctive example of a common architectural type. The structure lacks some character-defining features of cottages such as a porch with machine produced ornament, and the enclosure of the porch and construction of the rear addition have compromised the architectural integrity of the structure by altering the form and massing of the original design. The Moran Property is located on a 0.72 hectare (1.78 acre) parcel of land on the north side of Hughesville School Road. The residence was constructed in 1932, according to Charles County tax records, and contains 134 square meters (1444 square feet) of living space.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Moran Property is a 1½-story, 3-bay side-gable vernacular cottage on the north side of Hughesville School Road in Hughesville, Charles County. Constructed in 1932, the building has an enclosed front porch and a shed-roof addition at the rear.

The structure has a side-gable roof covered with asphalt shingles, a front-gable dormer, an exterior brick chimney, and an interior brick chimney. It is of wood-frame construction with vinyl siding and it has a concrete block foundation. The windows are 2/2 double-hung wood unless noted otherwise. The house has a shed roof porch, with a centered gable, on the front elevation. The porch has been enclosed; the first bay has been renovated into a bedroom, and the second and third bays are an entry and sitting area. The porch has a concrete block foundation and a full-width aluminum awning.

The west, or front elevation has a front-gable dormer and a centered gable on the shed-roof porch. The first story entrance is a centered wood door, accessed from the enclosed porch. The fenestration pattern is asymmetrical; the enclosed porch has a pair of double-hung windows in the first bay, and a series of six jalousie windows in the second and third bays. Two double-hung windows are located in the dormer. Alterations to the elevation include the addition of the enclosed porch and the installation of an aluminum awning.

The north elevation has a projecting gable bay in the center of the cottage. The projecting bay has a 1/1 double-hung window in the north wall, and 2/2 double-hung windows in both the east and west walls. Adjacent to the projecting bay is a large exterior brick chimney. The cottage has no other fenestration.

The rear, or south elevation has a 1-story shed-roof addition, concealing the third bay of the cottage. The addition has a centered 6-light wood door and a 2/2 double-hung window. Adjacent to the addition, in the center of the cottage, is a cellar door. The fenestration pattern of the cottage is irregular, with one 2/2 double-hung window in the first and second bays. The window in the second bay has an aluminum awning.

The south elevation has an irregular fenestration pattern, with two 2/2 double-hung windows on the first story and a pair of 2/2 double-hung windows in the gable end. The enclosed porch has two jalousie windows.

There are three outbuildings associated with this building. The first outbuilding is a garage with a front-gable roof covered with asphalt shingles. Constructed circa 1935, it is of wood-frame construction and it is located east of the cottage.

The second outbuilding is front-gable shed with an asphalt shingle roof. Constructed circa 1935, the shed is of wood-frame construction and is located east of the cottage and garage.

A third outbuilding is a woodshed with an asphalt shingle, shed-roof. Constructed circa 1960, the woodshed is of wood-frame construction and is located east of the cottage, south of the garage and shed.

7. Description (Continued)

The property is located on the north side of Hughesville School Road, at the intersection of Leonardtown Road. There is residential property to the north and a public park with baseball fields to the east. The site slopes gradually up to the east from Leonardtown Road, and contains small evergreen trees and shrubs. The property's setting is within the crossroads community of Hughesville, along a road that is a major transportation route.

8. Significance (Continued)

Directory and State Gazetteer listed both Episcopal and Roman Catholic churches in Hughesville as well as a Friends' school, four (4) general merchandise stores, two (2) saloons, two (2) undertakers, a wheelwright, a blacksmith, a tobacco buyer, and a population of fifty (50). Gannett's 1904 Gazetteer of Maryland defined Hughesville as a "post village...on the Washington, Potomac and Chesapeake Railroad" (Gannett 1904: 43). By 1906 the community was known as "a station of the Southern Maryland Railroad...and a banking town" with two (2) physicians, two (2) general stores, two (2) blacksmiths, a grist and saw mill, a flour mill, an undertaker and livery, a hotel, a hotel and saloon, a grocer and saloon, an insurance salesman, and a population of 150 (Maryland 1906: 667).

The Moran Property is a vernacular side-gable cottage. Between 1870 and 1940 the cottage style was typically built for Americans of modest means. They are characterized by simple ornamentation and mass-produced components, such as door frames, moldings, sash and window units, and porch decoration. The development of post-Civil War machinery capable of producing large amounts of standardized housing elements, such as those found in cottages, contributed greatly to the development of the modern American housing industry. Designs for vernacular cottages were obtained from popular magazines, such as House Beautiful, or carpenter's and builder's journals, such as American Builder. A variety of front-gable, side-gable, cross-gable and hipped roof cottages were developed in the early to mid-twentieth century. Front-gable and hipped roof cottages are primarily 1 to 1½-stories tall, 3-bays wide and several rooms deep. Side-gable and cross-gable structures are usually 2 to 2½-stories tall, are typically 2 to 3-bays in width and vary from one to three rooms deep. They usually include a porch covered with a shed roof. Porches are supported by posts often containing machine-produced Victorian ornamentation. Some cottages feature ornamentation drawn from Craftsman style or Colonial Revival architecture (Gottfried and Jennings 1988, viii-xv).

National Register Evaluation:

Constructed in 1932, the Moran Property is not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. The property is not eligible under Criterion A, as research conducted indicates no association with any historic events or trends significant in the development of national, state or local history. Historic research indicates that the property has no association with persons who have made specific contributions to history, and therefore, it does not meet Criterion B. It is not eligible under Criterion C, as it is an undistinctive example of a common architectural type. The structure lacks some character-defining features of cottages such as a porch with machine produced ornament, and the enclosure of the porch and construction of the rear addition have compromised the architectural integrity of the structure by altering the form and massing of the original design. Finally, the structure has no known potential to yield important information, and therefore, is not eligible under Criterion D.




