**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

After the present tenants leave, the house will be torn down. The owner wanted to know if any historical organization would be interested in acquiring it. Its postbellum date of construction and its need for major repairs make such an acquisition unfeasible.

This long frame house stands at the end of a dirt road about 600 ft. behind the site of the main house, which was torn down several years ago. According to Mrs. Mettam (whose great grandfather owned Rose Hill in the first half of the 19th century), family tradition maintains that this house was a slave cabin. In compliance with Mrs. Mettam's wishes, an investigation of the interior was not made. The house is inhabited by Mrs. Addie Hawkins and her family.

This one story house measures 38ft by 11ft 10in. and stands about 15ft. in height. It is built of two sections, the larger, western one appearing to be the earlier. That section has one central door, flanked by two tall, narrow windows with double hung sashes of four over four lights. The eastern section has one door and one window with a double hung sash of six over six lights.

The brick flues for wood-burning stoves inside each gable end are original; there was never an open hearth.

The interior, according to the tenants, is partitioned into three rooms. The upstairs chamber is sealed off; there is no stairway. Neither the present owner nor the tenants had heard of its being occupied.

The structure is sheathed with an assortment of loosely attached and warped clapboards. The newer siding is nailed over the older. The frame is a balloon frame; wire nails fasten the studs and corner posts to the sills. These features indicate that this house was constructed in the last quarter of the 19th century and was not a slave cabin.

According to the present owner, a small slave cemetery was located in a grove of cedars along the dirt drive to the tenant house. The site is overgrown with vines and brambles; no indications of grave sites could be found.





# LOCATION OF THE STEW CHIEF ON THE FLOOR PLAN






