



The main block of this two part house consisted of a two story, three bay, frame Federal farmhouse. At one end are two exterior chimneys. The interior is of simple Federal character with the exception of a very fine Federal mantle in the most recent addition which was removed from another house on the property. An earlier one and one half story frame wing standing at the rear elevation has an exterior chimney with a field-stone base. The modern addition stands at the north end of the main block and is of two story height.

There are several interesting structures on the property including what appears to be a one and one half story frame building characteristic of a small two room house of the mid to late 18th. century. Another tenant house on the property is of log construction and contains one ground floor room.
