The tobacco barn at Stoakley (CLVT-32) was demolished in December of 1976. That structure was part of a large farm called "Stoakley" that still survives as is evidenced by several other barns and outbuildings, a frame tenant house (had a log portion destroyed) and the main house.

This house has been altered greatly at least twice, however, its Federal Era quality is preserved by the side hull and double-parlor plan. It is quite like the "Reserve" (CLVT-30) in this respect.

Photographs taken during the Nineteenth Century and early Twentieth Century indicate that the house in its present form may be closer to its original appearance than during those periods. The second story oculors and deep cornices are not original.

A Nineteenth Century photograph shows the house with an addition on the east end that gave the house a full six bays on both floors. The gable end roof projected out beyond the edge on the front (south) to accommodate a second story gallery which ran the length of that facade. A later photograph shows that by this century the second floor porch had been removed, the roof shortened, and deep cornices added. This photo also shows the oculors. Still later, the entire east addition was removed reducing the house back to its original three bay width.

Each of the parlors and bedrooms above have fireplaces served by large enclosed chimneys. The north-west chimney has been altered and is non-functional.

Mrs. Robert Scrivener has prepared a collection of photographs, plats, and deeds relevant to "Stoakley" photo copy portions of which are attached.
