OLD SOLOMON'S HOUSE

ca. 1800

The earliest house now standing on Solomons Island is this two part frame structure. The main block is three bays in length having an end hall flanked by a single exterior chimney. In the early twentieth century a large central cross gable was added to the front roof slope. At one end stands a one and one half story wing with a single exterior chimney.

This is the earliest surviving house on Solomons Island. It faces southeast onto Farren Avenue and onto the Chesapeake Bay. The original portion of the house is a two-story single-pile framed or hewn-log structure with a hall-parlor or side-passage plan and one or two exterior brick gable-end chimneys. It is set onto a brick foundation. There is a one-story two-room nineteenth-century wing built onto the west gable end. The earliest surviving trim in the house dates from the Italianate era. The original partition wall has been removed from the original part of the house. The surviving chimney has stepped shoulders and is laid up in six-course common-bond brickwork. The added wing is also heated by way of an exterior brick chimney.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

In 1976 the Solomon's House was remodeled and at that time lost much of its original fabric and, hence, its original appearance. On the exterior this change was evidenced most significantly by the replacement of the 6/6 sash with modern thermal windows and by the addition of aluminum siding. The original siding was random width beaded clapboards. When examined in the spring of '76 both the main block and the single story wing had this siding. It was 7-8" wide on the lower half of the southwest end of the main block and c.12" wide on the lower half of the northeast end and rear (Northwest) facade.

It was also noted at that time there was serious sill rot on the northeast end. Siding was removed on the northwest corner for repairs thus exposing the frame. The frame is post-and-beam and made of hewn timbers. The sills were 5½" x 9" in thickness and the uprights 3" x 5½". They were joined by mortise-and-tenon and fixed with 1" thick trunnels.

Both sections of the house contain identical pedimented dormers on the rear or northwest side. They have deep cornices typical of the Greek Revival. The long single-story wing has two of these dormers on each side. The two story block, however, has but one pedimented dormer on the southwest (rear) side; it has a steeply pitched central gable on its main facade (southeast). This gable may well be a Victorian addition like its identical neighbor which appears in an early photograph of Point Patience.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

With its vertical thrust and side-hall-and-single parlor plan, Solomons House shares much with Sedwick House (CT-53) and Wall House (CT-56). All three of these houses have a side hall and a single large parlor heated by a fireplace served by a large exterior end-chimney. All three are block-like in size and have a vertical emphasis accentuated by tall windows, high eaves and the chimney. All three have single-story wings and at Wall House it projects off of the hall end of the main block.

Wall House and Sedwick House are believed to have been built by the same builder in the first quarter of the Nineteenth Century. Minus its cross-gable the main block of Solomons House is quite Federal in character and may be contemporary to the other two.



WITNESSETH, that in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and other valuable considerations, the said Edna Marsh Davis does grant and convey unto the said Joseph C. Lore, Jr., and G. I. Rupert Lore, their heirs and assigns, in fee simple subject, however, to the restriction hereinafter set forth, all that lot or parcel of land situated on Solomons Island contiguous with the waters of the Patuxent River and Mill Creek, and embraced according to a survey made by Louis H. 


