DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

On a hill east of the intersection of Chaneyville Road and Route 4, there is a tobacco barn which is not unusual in that it is made of hewn timbers joined by mortise-tenon and trunnels, measures C. 24' x 40' and has shed additions. There are three transvers. sills in the original portion and the usual arrangement of opposite doors with double doors on the sides. They are mounted on loop-end strap hinges.

It has been noticed during the survey that some barns have additions on the south facade which enable that side to be left open. In many instances the siding of the original barn is removed or the spaces inbetween boards left wider. It has been difficult to ascertain if the south shed is a later addition or part of the initial design which allows for increased ventilation.

The south addition on this barn extends 12' beyond the south wall of the main structure and runs its entire length. Undressed trees that are tenoned and pegged into a mortised continuous plate form a strange colenade of supports. An even rougher shed extends 6' beyond this one. The line of the original roof has been maintained this giving the barn an enormous cat-slide profile.

Hinges remaining on the door of the original south facade and the crudeness of the supports of the 12' south shed suggest that it is a later addition. The desirability, a "porch" on the south side of a tobacco barn, however, plus those instances where the widely spaced siding on that facade appear deliberate causes one to wonder about the original design.


