According to information prepared by SHA, the Charles Hardesty House, located at 983 German Chapel Road, Prince Frederick vicinity, does not meet any of the National Register Criteria for listing. The frame, cross gable house was constructed c. 1905 and was greatly enlarged by an addition to the south gable end in 1959. The house does not appear to embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction or possess high artistic value and lacks integrity. It is not located in any known historic district.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The present owner has lived in this general vicinity all of his life and has known the various occupants of this house. He remembers it being here when he graduated from high school in 1925. He associates the age of the house with that of the store at Port Republic (c. 1900), since "Charley Hardesty" is said to have built it.

A somewhat complicated title-search does show Charles J. Hardesty acquiring ten acres of this property on April 3, 1903 (GWD 4/58).

Additions altar the original appearance of the building, but the distinctive cross gable facade is still visible. The original house faces east. It is a wooden frame dwelling, two stories high, three bays wide, and one deep. It has a central plan (parlors divided by hall) accentuated by the fenestration and the steeply pitched central pediment. That feature is decorated by a fanlight window.

There have been two additions made to the north end of the house and at least one in the rear (west). It is unclear if the original kitchen wing was single story or double. Modern siding and interior finish cover construction details. There is a full porch running across the first facade which has been modified and added on to.

The original exterior was clapboard. Modern shingles replace what may have been a metal roof.












