North Beach does not appear to meet the National Register Criteria for Evaluation. The town undoubtedly has *historical significance* as a beach resort of the first half of the 20th century. In addition, it possesses a distinctive character and certain unity of appearance, due in large part to a consistency of massing and rhythm. However, it lacks sufficient integrity to convey a sense of the early- to mid-20th century resort. More than 50% of the buildings within the town appear to be modern or so substantially altered that they no longer retain a sense of their historic character. Vinyl and aluminum siding, replacement windows and unsympathetic additions and alterations abound.

There may be some smaller groupings of buildings within the town which retain sufficient integrity to be eligible for the Register. Further investigation would be necessary to identify such groupings. No such groupings were evident in the waterfront area, which has been subjected to much alteration and infill.






