Early 20th Century

Alterations and aluminum siding have changed the appearance of this two-story frame farmhouse. The three-bay long by one-bay deep main block is followed by a two-story kitchen ell to the rear. A screened porch shelters the east-facing facade of the main house, while a southern enclosed porch adjoins the kitchen.

Brick stove flues heat the south gable end of the main house and the west gable end of the kitchen. Asymmetrical fenestration on the facade suggest that the north end may be a later addition.


