This two-story frame house measures three bays wide by one bay deep. A prominent cross-gable distinguishes the facade. The gable-roofed house includes a front porch and a rear kitchen. 2/2 sash windows light the dwelling.

The structure is covered with asbestos shingle siding and has decorative "fish scale" shingles in the gables. The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation. A hipped roof porch extends across the front. Two interior brick chimneys are located on either side of the cross gable and a third newer brick flue is located inside the gable end of the ell.


