This two-story frame house measures three-bays wide by one-bay deep. A prominent cross-gable distinguishes the facade. The gable-roofed house includes a front porch and a rear kitchen. 2/2 sash windows light the dwelling. Attached to its west end is a three bay by one bay addition, also with a cross gable. The main entrance is located in the east end of the front elevation. The structure is covered with aluminum siding and has decorative diamond shaped shingles in the cross gables.

The house faces south onto Hunting Creek Road (Hwy. 521). The form of the house is best described as two three-bay I-houses slightly offset and joined at the gable end. It is a two-story, framed and weatherboarded structure. The trim of the main sections of the house has been so completely altered on the exterior that it is impossible to determine whether they were built at the same, or at different times. Their proportions suggest that they were built concurrently. The forward-set half of the house -- the east half -- has a side-passage-parlor plan. The set-back west half of the house has no front access to the exterior. All three bays are windows. Both sections are heated by interior brick stove flues. The original sash are two-over-one double-hung. The gable roofs of both sections have central front-facing gables that are filled in with early or original diamond-shaped wood shingles. A one-story hipped-roof porch shelters the south and east sides of the east half of the house. The porch is set on turned posts and has sawn brackets. There are recent additions to the rear. The whole house has recently been sheathed with vinyl siding.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two-story frame house measures three bays wide by one bay deep. A prominent cross-gable distinguishes the facade. The gable-roofed house includes a front porch and a rear kitchen. 2/2 sash windows light the dwelling.

Attached to its west end is another three bay by one bay addition, also with a cross gable. It is indented slightly from the facade line of the first part. The entire structure is covered with narrow width aluminum siding. The cross gables are accented with decorative diamond shaped shingles.

The main entrance is located in the east end of the front or south elevation. It includes a transom and side lights around the door. A wrap around porch extends along two sides of the main part of the house. It is supported by turned posts with decorative scroll cut brackets.

There is a small semi-circular window in the east gable end. An interior chimney is located east of the cross gable of the main section.






