DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is a two story, five bay L-shaped frame structure with a central cross-gable. The placement of the openings in the front elevation is irregular with the south bay being set-off and separated from the others. Windows have six over six pane sashes. The main entrance is located in the central bay of the front or east elevation. Brick chimneys with corbels at their tops extend from inside the gable walls. A one story hip roofed porch spans the front of the house. It is supported by turned posts with decorative scroll cut brackets.

A frame tobacco barn is located behind the house.


