## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This true 1½ story house is built of rusticated concrete blocks. The gabled building measures three bays wide by four bays deep. A one bay kitchen ell adjoins the rear of the south-facing house at its east end.

The facade's entrance is located west of center. The left bay projects lightly. It is lit by a three over one window adjoined by a two over one window to either side. Similar windows light the facade's two gabled wall dormers. Label-molded concrete lintels head the windows. A single-window wall dormer lights the kitchen's east side.

Brick chimneys appear at the junction of the two sections and at the center of the main block's west end.






