This two-story frame house includes a rear one-story hyphen connecting a two-story section. The east facade is embellished by a cross-gable and a finely-trimmed porch.

An interior brick chimney heats either end of the house, and a third chimney heats the ell. Entrances appear on the facade, on the north side of the hyphen, and also on the north side of the ell.

Six over six sash windows light the house. Asphalt shingles cover the roof, and weatherboards sheath the walls. The house stands on brick piers.
