This old house -- built around 1900 -- has been altered in a heavy-handed way into a builder's office. It faces east onto Old Town Road. Set on a decoratively molded concrete block foundation, it is a square-plan one-and-a-half-story, framed and weatherboarded house with a pyramidal roof and a hipped-roof polygonal bay at the southeast corner. Hipped dormers are set into the east and west faces of the roof. All of the windows have added one-over-one double-hung sash. Recent additions include a broad three-bay enclosed porch with a baluster around the top. A two-bay extension was added to the south side. Behind the house is a one-story concrete block shopping center. It has a brick veneer and a gable roof. Its ten vehicle bays indicate that it was designed with a range of purposes in mind, but it presently serves as a small shopping center.


