Section 10.


The property consists of 1.74 acres located on the Broomes Island USGS quad map.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although oral history places an early date to this house it is probably little more than fifty or sixty years old. This doesn't, however, make it a worthless building. It apparently was constructed out of salvage materials by Julius Gray to serve as a tenant house on his farm. The Gray sisters recall that the tenant house was built after the main house (CT-265) which was built c. 1910.
