

CAPSULE SUMMARY CT-1147

The Myrtle William barn is located on highway 765, just south of its intersection with Long Beach Drive. It is part of a farm complex with a house and three other tobacco barns. Two of the barns are to the east and one is to the north. The house appears to be a nineteenth century farm house. Myrtle William barn measures twenty-four by forty-eight feet. The cross-axial plan and steep roof indicate that it is of nineteenth century date.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Pre-1882 Wills and Deeds in the possession of the Williams family show their ownership to date back to the 1850's. The farm was owned at that time by the present owner's great-grandfather, Benjamin Williams.

The house which was in the property at that time burned in 1954, and it would appear that the only surviving building is the tobacco barn closest to Route 2 and 4. The barn was full of tobacco at the time it was examined, but several observations were made:

It is a twelve-room barn (48' x 24') and has a heavy post-and-beam frame, which utilizes mortise-tenon joints fixed with trunnels. Like Edgar Cranford's barn (CLVT-) and some others in the area, the angle braces are joined to the sills and uprights via open faced dovetail joints. Although a wooden peg fixes the joint, nails are often used for reinforcement. In this case, wire nails have been used.

Although the heavy sills are hewn, much circular sawn material was seen elsewhere in the frame. These may be replacement materials, the owner insists that Benjamin Williams built the barn "over a hundred years ago."

Circular sawn materials and wire nails do not preclude a late Nineteenth Century building date, but they probably cannot date before 1890. More information is needed, however, concerning the history of circular sawn lumber in this county. The plan of the barn and the utilization of open-faced dovetail joints gives it much in common with at least two other barns that have been given a mid-late Nineteenth Century building date.

7. DESCRIPTION CT-1147

The Myrtle William barn is located on highway 765, just south of its intersection with Long Beach Drive. It is part of a farm complex with a house and three other tobacco barns. Two of the barns are to the east and one is to the north. The house appears to be a nineteenth century farm house. This barn was recorded from the exterior.

Myrtle William barn measures twenty-four by forty-eight feet. The cross-axial plan and steep roof indicate that it is of nineteenth century date. The measurements are somewhat unusual, and may be the result of a substantial later addition to a small barn. The barn has twelve foot wide sheds on the south and west. Vertical siding with hinged ventilation doors, covers the exterior. There are double doorways on the south and west sheds (two on the west shed), and one double doorway on the north side of the west shed. The east side was not visible. The north part of the barn has an underground stripping area, and may indicate that this is the section where the addition was built.

8. SIGNIFICANCE CT-1147

This barn is almost certainly of nineteenth-century date and is part of a large agricultural complex. The steep roof and cross-axial plan date it to this period. The barn is located on what used to be the principal thoroughfare through the county, and as such, was seen by many persons and was a focal point of the landscape.

This barn also yields information regarding agricultural history in Southern Maryland. In February 1990, a tobacco barn survey was initiated in order to study the tobacco barns of Calvert County. Until fairly recently, tobacco was the most important farm crop of the county. More acreage was devoted to its cultivation than for both of the next most extensive farm products (corn and wheat). The barns and stripping houses related to this "Tobacco Culture" are widely recognized as the most common element on the rural landscape. These structures are also the most threatened, as the market for tobacco declines. They seem to have, at present, only limited capabilities for re-use. Many barns and stripping houses now stand empty. The purpose of this survey has been to gather information and document a wide sample of these structures before they disappear from the landscape.




