The Wallville School (African American) Teacherage is significant as one of the few known extant teacherages in Calvert County. It was identified by Elizabeth Gross who lived there in the 1930s while teaching at the nearby Wallville (African American) School. A simple vernacular residence, it is two stories in height, two bays wide, with a rear ell.

The Wallville School (African American) Teacherage is located across Mackall Road from the old Wallville (white) School at the end of a long driveway. This small house is set in a grove of trees.

The two story, wood-framed house is two bays wide with a rear ell. A shed-roofed porch extends the width of the facade. The porch slab is constructed of concrete, and the porch roof is supported by plain wood posts, square in section. The porch shelters a modern, four-light door, located in the south facade bay. Fenestration of the main block consists of one over one, double-hung sash windows.

Because the property was posted with no trespassing signs, the rear of the house was not examined. As noted, an ell extends from the rear wall of the house. The house is sheathed in aluminum siding, and its roof is sheathed in crimped metal sheets.

The house was a teacherage for African American teachers; they walked from there to the Wallville School on Lloyd Bowen Road. Long-time teacher Mrs. Elizabeth Gross lived there in the 1930s when she taught in the Wallville School. At that time the house was owned by the Coates family.

This house is one of few identified African American teacherages in the county. Others, including two identified by Elizabeth Gross in the southern portion of the county, one identified by Ailene Stamper in Prince Frederick, and another identified by Miss Stamper in the northern part of the county, have been demolished. The only other known standing African American teacherage is Miss Stampers' present home on Dares Beach Road (CT-1018).
