DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Middleville is a large country house which is composed of a two story, three bay long central portion with one and one-half story wings on each side. The southeast wing appears to be the earliest portion of the dwelling and was probably a typical small three bay long building with two dormers on each side of the 'A' roof. It has been completely remodeled on both exterior and interior but the proportions appear to belong to the type building constructed frequently in the early nineteenth century.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The significance of this structure is hard to determine in its present condition. If, however, a study were undertaken on the overall vernacular dwellings of Talbot County, this may prove to be a useful example.

On the same farm is a tenant house which appears to be a typical dwelling of the second quarter of the nineteenth century. It is three bays long and two stories tall with an addition of another two bays and a leanto. This building might also prove of interest in a study of vernacular structures.
