Cellar Hill is a Neoclassical structure which was built in the 1940s by Lawrence Lithicum Parlett. This structure is of interest because of its architectural style which is not greatly in evidence in St. Mary's County.

Lawrence and Louise Parlett purchased the property which comprises this tract in 1939 and 1940. The land was originally part of a larger tract known as "Satisfaction," "Town Neck," or "Trent Neck." According to local tradition, the name "Cellar Hill" derives from the legend that during the War of 1812 residents in the area buried their valuables in the cellar of an old house which once stood on this hill. The current owner claims that there is no evidence of this supposed structure on the property today.

Cellar Hill is located on the east side of Route 6 (New Market - Turner Road) between Trent Hall Road and Parlett-Morgan Road near Trent Hall. The house stands alone on a ridge in the landscape. Cellar Hill faces east towards the Patuxent River with its principal gable oriented on a north/south axis.

Neoclassical in style, Cellar Hill consists of two building periods. In 1940, owner Lawrence Lithicum Parlett designed and built the center two-and-a-half story section. In 1948, wings were added onto both the north and south ends of the house.

The east elevation of Cellar Hill consists of a two-and-a-half story central section with three gable roof dormers and a full-height entry porch. To the north of this section extends a one-story and then a two-story wing. To the south of this section stands a two-story wing.

(A complete verbal description of the property cannot be given because the owner denied the surveyor access to the property in 1994.)




