

The next step up from a one-room, side-passage house was one like this with a side passage, one heated front room, and a small, cold room behind, all under a symmetrical gable roof. Its increased depth (28 feet compared with a width of 24 feet) made room upstairs for a second chamber, it too unheated of course. Also a closet built into the NE corner of the side passage upstairs.

Interior sparsely trimmed. Molded handrail; straight, long-section balusters; mantelpiece in main room has plain entablature supported on deeply engaged columns; original doors have two long panels in the Greek Revival idiom, but look curiously old-fashioned in that the panels themselves are raised. All consistent with the ^{machine-}mature cut nails used to build the frame. The architectural historian scarcely needs the *terminus post quem* provided by the butt doorhinges marked BALDWIN PATENT (see *Cherryfields* [pp.] and [pp.]).

Chimney stack built of stone, rendered, and scored to look like ashlar to the level of the eaves; brick ^{fue}above and ~~to line both~~ fireboxes.

This side passage house with one heated front room and a small cold room behind is an advanced version of the one room, side passage house. The two upstairs chambers are unheated. The interior has little detail but it is all original. The chimney stack of stone at one end is stuccoed and scored to simulate ashlar to the eaves; above that the flue and fireboxes are brick.
