 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Clark Farm is set back from the north side of Maryland Route 5, west of Leonardtown. Approached by a dirt drive, it sits on a slight rise in a group of trees, surrounded by farmland. The complex contains a house, and outbuildings to its north.

The house faces south to Route 5, and is two stories high, gable roofed, and sheathed with white clapboards. It is in three sections: a central three bay wide block, with its roof ridge parallel to Route 5, a two bay section to its west, and set further back on the east, another three bay wide wing. A one story shed roof addition is located to the rear of the central section.

The principal facade of the central section has three 6/6 windows with shutters across its second floor, and a door and two windows in the first floor. A wooden one-story screen porch extends along this facade. In the rear, there are three 6/6 windows with shutters, and the one story shed roof addition which has a door and two windows. A brick interior chimney is located on the east end, and another brick interior chimney is located to the rear of the roof ridge on the east end. The east gable end of the central section has two windows in each story, located close together in the north end of the wall.

The west wing has two 6/6 windows with shutters in the second floor of its south facade, and below, a newer three-part window covered by a roof. It is one bay deep, with a projecting, one bay deep and one bay wide, gable ended ell in the rear. This wing has a brick end chimney on its west end. The east wing has three 6/6 windows with shutters on its second floor, and a wooden screen porch partially enclosed, along the first floor. In the rear there are two windows on the second floor, none on the first floor. There is a brick exterior end chimney on this wing.

To the north is a garage, and further north, assorted barns and sheds.
