Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

Alumni Hall is a one story brick building set on a high foundation and is three bays wide and seven bays long with a gable roof and an entrance on the east gable. Built in 1922, the building is laid in American bond with each bay marked by a brick pilaster. There are large brick piers which rise from each corner and are connected at the gable ends by a high brick wall, creating a false, flat-roofed facade. The double door with transom, at the top of a flight of seven stone steps on the east facade is framed by a gabled portico supported by square brick piers with bases and capitals. The portico is flanked by paned windows with jalousies. Set within the gable of the portico is the date "1922" while along the cornice below are the words "Alumni Hall". There is a small entrance at the corner of the south elevation.

Alumni Hall was built to serve as the school gymnasium and is connected to nearby Keach Hall by a hyphen which contains showers and changing rooms. Most of the building is taken up by the indoor sports room along with a few small rooms once used as offices. The building is in deteriorated condition and all of the 6/6 sash windows are boarded from the outside.

Alumni Hall, built in 1922, served as the gymnasium for Charlotte Hall School until the school closed in 1976. For most of its history Charlotte Hall School was a military academy and the gymnasium was often used as an indoor rifle range. The Annual Ball, a Charlotte Hall tradition which dated from the early years of the school and one of the leading social events in St. Marys County, was held in Alumni Hall until 1967 when the event was discontinued.

Because the records of Charlotte Hall School were not made available by the trustees of the school, a further investigation of the history of Alumni Hall was not possible.




