DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

At the southern tip of Lee Haven Road stands an outbuilding of an earlier dwelling which is a rare survival this late in the 20th century. The small two story building is approximately sixteen feet square and stands upon a brick foundation. From the center of the 'A' roof is a well built chimney retaining a handsome cap composed of four corbeled brick courses. Its walls are covered with vertical boards and battens and the walls are punctuated by several six-pane casements. The outline of a former leanto can be seen on the west side of the structure.

Its interior has been remodeled with a narrow board floor, a sheet rock ceiling and an enclosure around the stair to the second story. Although the building is one room on the first story, there is a fireplace with opening facing east, indicating the possibility that there were originally two rooms. From evidence upstairs, the joists and ceiling were originally exposed and whitewashed. The second story is divided into two rooms by rough-sawn boards at the head of the steep stair.
