DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>The Faulkner Farmhouse, at the time of the survey, was concealed from sight by a very ordinary two story late 19th century frame structure. This being removed, the early building emerged as a very picturesque structure with gable facing the road, impressive because of its double chimneys.</p> <p>On close examination, it was found that the 1½ story brick structure contained remains of yet an earlier building/buildings. Archeology undertaken by the owners revealed the foundations of two wings and two 10' square outbuildings, one of which still stands.</p> <p>Apparently, the original building on the site was one of wings, or perhaps, both of them, each of which measured about 18'x 20'. These two structures were joined by a 12' wide hyphen (with brick walls). Later there appears to have been an additional room built behind the hyphen. And finally, the hyphen and old foundation was almost completely encased in the current 1½ story brick structure, around 1810-30. The existing building was the central block measuring 18'x 20', perpendicular to the wings. Its gables both show the roof lines of the first buildings. On the north side<sup>of</sup> the west wing can also be seen the lines of at least two porch roofs.</p> <p>The plan of the original house is unknown, but the existing section has a small entry with fireplace on the west with adjoining cabinet. On the opposite side of the room is evidence of a stair in the southeast corner. Behind the entry is a small living room. The second floor has two bed chambers.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

The Faulkner Farmhouse is important because it is a good example of the additive principal of vernacular buildings. Moreover, in its original appearance it had a form more commonly associated with the Eastern Shore of Virginia, with two separate structures joined by a smaller third section. In its early 19th century appearance, it was more like the houses of southern Maryland. It is also of importance because of the existence of a small original smokehouse.




