There is a full foundation and three brick chimneys. The wing has two windows and an off-center door. It has plain clapboard without beading. There is a small vestibule off the rear of the dwelling. Although it is unpainted, it is still in good structural condition.</p> <p>The floor plan consists of a parlor and stair hall in the large part with dining room and kitchen in the wing with an enclosed stair ascending between the two rooms from the kitchen. The interior trim is intact and very restorable, although the balustrade has been vandalized.</p> </div>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The house is a very good, well proportioned structure but is not maintained. It resembles several such houses along Rt. 50.

Correction on Vincent property at Linkwood:  
Mrs. James Johnson July, 1975

"Property called "Canterbury," later "Canterbury's Regulation,"

Property patented in 1674 to William Forde.

A house built circa 1733 by Rebecca Brannock Harwood. (undocumented)

Deed dated 5/8/1733 from Thomas Brannock, son of Rebecca by first marriage, to Henry Trippe mentions house, garden, orchards, etc.

The house originally had 3 full stories in the larger section. However, fire destroyed the entire third floor around 1945, and it was never replaced.

During the Victorian era, porches were added, since removed. Chimney alterations were made during this same period.

Around the turn of present century Canterbury became "Linkwood Stock Farm", where thoroughbred race horses were bred and trained. "Linkwood Maid" and Linkwood Chief" were two of these horses who raced with considerable success. The names of these horses were carved into the beams of their stables in old barn, since destroyed."


