DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small and low brick building, constructed sometime in the mid 20th century, is non-distinctive in appearance. Opposite the double glass door are two large windows with 20 lights each. Below these windows are Neo-Georgian style panels. In each end bay is a six over six sash window with a flat arch above with keystone. Like many other 20th century buildings with Colonial Revival elements, these features are "cliches" lacking the quality of the architectural components which they imitate.



SITE OF D-373

Braly's Brick Hotel at 116 High Street was built in 1892; it was first occupied by John G. Hurley, who operated a confectionery, ice cream and restaurant business. In 1895 Hurley leased the building to E. E. Braly as a hotel. The photograph, which was taken in the 1950s, shows George O. Dashiell's newsstand at the left front of the building. The hotel was destroyed on January 5, 1962, and was replaced by a brick building that houses the consumers' loan department of the National Bank of Cambridge. Courtesy of William D. Brightwell
