DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>Madison is now by-passed by Md. Rt. 16, but the main road to Taylor's Island was formerly the main street which meanders along with the contours of Madison Bay.</p> <p>The town has an interesting collection of buildings dating from the 19th and early 20th centuries. Of the earliest forms of building, there are about four to six, i.e. one and one-half story frame structures, either two or three bays long. The second most popular form of Dorchester County building, The two story frame, three bay long structure, number about six to eight. There are two good late 19th century buildings having good "carpenters lace" porches. There are also two early 20th century bungaloid style structures.</p> <p>Under separate cover are the William Harrington House (D-32), boyhood home of Gov. Harrington (D-227), Madison M.E. Church (D-258), and the Madison School (D-259). There is also a second Methodist church and several buildings to the south of the main town along Whitmarsh Road.</p> <p>The condition of the dwellings is slightly on the unkept side, but with a little paint and planting, Madison would become as charming a place as Woolford or Church Creek.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to Elias Jones, History of Dorchester County, there was a village in this location as early as 1760. It seems to have been called Tobacco Stick and the body of water on which the village is located also went by that name.

The chief reasons for its rise as a village was the lumber business and the ship building industry. Madison also had a cannery, and an oyster fleet.

Madison is an important town because of its being a home of Governor Emerson C. Harrington.




