DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

One of the old outbuildings remaining on the Owings farm is this unusual pyramidal dairy. The walls of the body of the small building are constructed of bricks which are 2" X 8" X 4" in size and are laid in common bond. Three courses measure 6 3/4" - 7" and the walls are 9" thick. The area under the overhanging roof is paved in a herringbone pattern with irregularly shaped bricks.

Except for the posts and plate, the roof is constructed of sawn structural members fastened with wire nails. The cupula and fence were rebuilt when the roof was reshingled.

The interior of the dairy is finished with plaster on sawn lath . The floor and the cooling tanks are concrete and are later additions.

Windows have 3/6 sash and a 1 3/4" bead and fillet frame. The wooden door has three recessed vertical panels.




