1722

Stinton is the oldest positively dated house in Queen Anne's County and is one of the earliest dated buildings in Maryland. It is unfortunate that only the brick exterior walls remain of the original structure, and that these are almost entirely stuccoed and covered with later additions. The date 1722 in the southeast gable, and glazed chevrons in the northwest gable are the only early features of any significance to survive.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Stinton, also known as Old Point, is located on the north side of Batts Neck Road on Kent Island, approximately three miles south of Stevensville. The house is sited on Batts Neck overlooking the junction of Warehouse Creek and Cox Creek.

This early 18th century brick house is 1 1/2 stories high, five bays wide and one room deep, with flush brick chimneys at either end of a steeply pitched gable roof. Dated 1722, it is unfortunate that the building has been completely gutted by several renovations. The original form and detailing is further obscured by several modern additions, porches, full length dormers on both facades, and a coat of stucco that covers the majority of the exterior walls.

The northeast facade, facing the water, is almost entirely covered by an enclosed porch. A door in the center bay is flanked on each side by two large 6/6 windows. A water table is visible under the coat of stucco. The roof has been completely rebuilt and a shed roof dormer window now stretches the full length of the facade.

## 7.1 DESCRIPTION

There is no evidence of openings on the southeast gable, but the only section of wall that is not stuccoed is a panel in the upper gable. The brickwork exposed here is laid in English bond with the date "1722" set in glazed header bricks.

The southwest facade is similar to the water facade, with five symmetrical bays. The center bay is covered by a modern entrance addition. A shed roof dormer stretches the full length of this facade as well.

The northwest gable wall is covered by a modern two story addition. From the attic of this addition it is possible to examine the upper part of the northwest gable of the original house. The brickwork is laid in staggered Flemish bond with glazed headers forming the upper part of a series of chevrons, probably similar to the decorative chevrons in the gable of Dixie (QA-202), located nearby.

The interior of the house has been completely gutted and rebuilt, from the cellar to the ridge of the roof. The only original fabric that could be located besides the brick exterior walls was one pair of gable rafters in the northwest end of the roof. It is not clear why these survived.


