This frame Victorian house was constructed in 1888 for Mrs. S. E. Newnam by Christopher P. Walters, a local carpenter and builder who was active in Centreville in the last quarter of the 19th century and the early 20th century. In 1928 it was purchased by W. Edward Barton, a local cabinetmaker, who made several changes to the house to modernize it, but otherwise carefully maintained the Victorian appearance. The original building contract, dated August 15, 1888, and an early photograph of the house remain in the possession of Mr. Barton's daughter, the present owner. The contract price for the house was \$2620, to be paid with a lot valued at \$600 and the balance in cash.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Barton House is located on the north side of Chesterfield Avenue west of Broadway in Centreville. Constructed in 1888, it is the oldest house on this section of Chesterfield Avenue, which remained relatively undeveloped until the turn of the century.

Of frame construction on a continuous brick foundation, the Barton house is 2 1/2 stories high with an asymmetrical cross plan. The front facade consists of a projecting semi-octagonal bay to the right and double entrance doors set back to the left. The projecting bay is pierced by four 1/1 windows on the first and second floor. The upper gable is highly decorative, with a small paired window in the center flanked by applied strapwork on either side and a horizontal band of geometric strapwork below. The deeply overhanging eaves of the steeply pitched gable roof are tricked out with Eastlake verge boards and decorative scrollwork in the apex. The door to the left is set off by sidelights and a transom; there is a single 1/1 window above the door on the second floor. The

This house was one of the first constructed on Chesterfield Avenue, an area that was developed in the late 1890's and early 1900's. Christopher Walters is said to have built many of the houses

first and second story are covered with horizontal German siding; the slate roof is embellished with bands of fishscale decoration. A one story porch wraps around the front and east wall of the house. The present porch columns replace original turned posts with brackets and low railings.

The front entrance is located on the south wall of a projecting cross wing that encompasses the interior entrance hall and stair. The only opening in the west wall of this cross wing is a 2/2 window with peaked upper sash in the third story gable. To the rear of the cross gable the west facade is protected by a two story porch with an ornate scrollwork ballustrade on the second floor. A door opens onto the porch on each floor, and 2/2 windows are asymmetrically arranged to provide light and ventilation to the rear rooms.

On the east facade, a second cross gable projects near the center, with two 1/1 windows to the left and a small enclosed side porch to the right. The first floor of the cross gable is semi-octagonal, with single 1/1 windows in each of the three primary facets. On the second story the projection is rectangular, with 1/1 windows. Other openings include a 1/1 window to

the left of the cross gable on the second floor and a pitched roof dormer on the third floor. To the rear of the cross gable, the original side entrance porch has been enclosed and converted to a powder room. There are two 2/2 windows to the right of the powder room on the first floor and three 2/2 windows on the second floor.

A shed lean-to covers the rear wall of the house. A flush brick chimney rises at the center of this wall, with a single 2/2 window on the second floor to the right of the chimney.

The interior plan consists of an entrance and stair hall along the west side of the house, with a front parlor to the right and a dining room to the rear. A door in the rear of the dining room opens into a short hall that leads back to the kitchen, which is located at the rear of the house. Doors in the hall open into a pantry, a powder room, and a back stair. The rear lean-to, beyond the kitchen, serves as a utility and storage room.

When Edward Barton purchased the house in 1928 he made several alterations. The most significant of these was to open up the east wall of the front hall, bringing more light into the hall and giving an increased feeling

of space to the front parlor and the dining room.

The stair rises against the west wall of the hall to a landing at the rear, turns 90 degrees and rises to the second floor. It is an open-string stair with square-section Eastlake newel posts, turned balusters, and a molded walnut handrail. The carriage is plain; the area below the carriage is plastered, not paneled. Decorative trim includes the original reeded architrave trim, circa 1928 architrave trim, and a pair of columns added in 1928 when the hall partition was removed. The fireplace in the front parlor has been rebuilt; there is no evidence of a corresponding fireplace for the dining room.

The second floor plan consists of a stair hall along the front west wall and a second hall leading to the rear of the house along the west wall. There are bedrooms above the front parlor and the dining room. The rear hall leads back to the kitchen stairs, a bathroom above the pantry, and a rear bedroom over the kitchen.

The front stair continues up to a pair of finished garrett rooms and an unfinished attic on the third floor.






