 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Clark House was located on the west side of Maryland Route 8 in Stevensville, approximately 100 yards south of the main intersection in the center of town.

This small frame house was demolished in 1979 and replaced with a modern real estate office that bears a striking resemblance in overall form to the early house.

The Clark House was examined in March, 1977 by James T. Wollon, Jr. (AIA) of Havre de Grace as part of a study undertaken by Mr. Wollon and Mildred Schoch of nearby Chester. Mr. Wollon's brief description of the house is the only surviving record and is reproduced here in full.

The CLARK HOUSE is a frame house of two sections: a one and one-half storey section, probably dating from the mid-nineteenth century or slightly earlier; and a two storey section dating from the early twentieth century. Exterior walls of the older section are covered with board-and-batten siding

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This small frame house is representative of the inexpensive, plainly built tenant houses found throughout the Tidewater region. It was constructed in two stages, and as is often the case, the smaller story-and-a-half wing is the earlier part of the house. Dating to the mid-19th century, this roughly built structure was evidently moved to Stevensville from an unknown location nearby, and in the early 20th century was enlarged by the addition of the two story section to the north.
