<p>The Tull House is a one-room, one-story, frame dwelling built on brick piers. It is three bays long and one bay deep. The center bay being a batten door. The pegged frame is covered with clapboard, some being beaded. The sash on the house is six over six, even the one on the east gable. There are two small casements on the west gable.</p> <p>There are no soffit and fascia boards remaining on the facade but there are curved end boards typical of many smaller houses in Worcester County.</p> <p>To the rear of the house is a passage and a kitchen set at right angles to the roof of the front house. The size and shape of the kitchen is almost identical to the former part.</p>
