NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC <i>NO</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Kenwood is typical of the Federal Houses in and around Berlin, with its gable facing the street and being three bays long and three bays deep. It is a frame structure covered with beaded clapboard and built upon a brick foundation. The entrance is located in the center of the gable-facade and is trimmed by an open pediment with fanlight supported on fluted pilasters having sunbursts on its capitals. On second story is a Palladian style window, the center of which has been lengthened to give access to the second floor of the two-story porch. The cornice has modillions and a fascia with inverted scollops with sways of drill-holes beneath. This extends the three sides of the building and forms a pediment on the Main Street facade.
