Description:

The Mayor and Council Office is located at the northwest corner of Bay and Williams Streets. The rectangular building, of red brick laid in stretcher bond is 2 storys in height with regular 1/1 fenestration. Double rows of headers form segmental arches over door and window openings. The roof of the building is flat and declines slightly toward the south.

Changes to the building include the removal of a decorative brick cornice, evidence of which remains in a single corbel on the front wall; the replacement of some of the original windows with newer windows, and the sealing of some door and window opening on the rear facade. The building is presently in a good state of repair.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The building occupied by the Mayor and Council Office and Police Department contributes to the visual continuity and character of the Berlin Commercial District. Its scale, materials and massing combine to relate it to the core buildings in the district. Although its original integrity has been diminished by the altering of door and window openings and the removal of its corbelled cornice, it nevertheless is recognizable as an original component of the 19th century district.


