St. Michaels Ice Cream Parlor description

The St. Michaels Ice Cream Parlor stands on the southeast corner of Talbot and Cherry Street at the north end of the center business district in St. Michaels, Talbot County, Maryland. The single-story shop faces west with the gable oriented on an east/west axis.

The c. 1880 single-story frame structure is supported by a minimal brick foundation and is uniformly sheathed with asbestos siding. The medium pitched roof is covered with a layer of sheet tin.

The west (main) elevation is a gable-front facade with a center recessed entrance and flanking multi-pane windows. The front door is pierced by an oval glass window. A metal awning shades the first floor. The gable-front wall is undistinguished, but the roof line is decorated with a sawn bargeboard identical to the decorative trim on the adjacent Gingerbread house.

The side elevations are finished in a plain manner. A service window has been added to the north side.

The rear (east) elevation is covered by a shed roof addition which has a stuccoed chimney rising from the northeast corner. A four-panel door permits entry into the shed section on the east wall.

The interior has been refitted as an ice cream parlor. Evidently the rectangular space had been divided into two rooms which has now been consolidated into one. The most significant feature of the interior is its pressed tin ceiling and walls. The area below the chair rail level is sheathed with beaded board wainscoting.


