Hudson's Pharmacy occupies an important location in the core of St. Michaels business district on the corner of Talbot Street and an alley that leads to back street parking. Aside from the pressed tin shingle roof and the interior end brick chimneys, the Victorian period exterior has been obscured with modern alterations and materials. Inside, the first floor interior has been extensively remodeled. During one renovation when an old part of the soda fountain was removed, it had the date 1889 scrawled on the back. The second floor retains its original partitions with late nineteenth-century oak grained doors and surrounds.

Hudson's Pharmacy description

Hudson's Pharmacy stands in the center of the St. Michaels business district on the west side of Talbot Street. The pharmacy is flanked by an alley to the south and the Town Hall Mall to the north. The two-story five-bay frame store faces east with the principal gable running on a north/south axis.

Supported by a stuccoed masonry foundation, the c. 1880 frame store has been resheathed with beaded aluminum siding and is covered by a pressed tin shingle roof.

The east (main) elevation is a symmetrical five-bay facade, however the entire store front has been altered with multi-pane display windows and a heavy frame awning, evidently applied when the store was remodeled in the 1970's. The awning stretches across the south end shed addition as well as the single-story section to the north which appears to have been originally built as a part of the Town Hall Mall. The front cornice of the north section is identical to the cornice of the identical section on the north side of the Town Hall Mall. The second floor of the pharmacy is lighted by five single pane sash windows that are flanked by louvered aluminum shutters. The cornice is boxed.

The south gable end is covered on the first floor by a shed roofed addition with a parapet roof in front. Lighting the second floor and attic are two single-pane sash windows that flank the interior end brick stove stack.

The west (rear) elevation is covered on the first floor by a modern rear wing sheathed with beaded aluminum siding. The rear wing is covered by a low-pitched flounder roof sheathed with asphalt shingles. A patch in the pressed tin shingle roof of the main block indicates the location of the gable roof of the former rear wing.

The north gable end is largely covered by the single-story section with a parapet roof, but an intact 6/6 sash window remains in the upper gable. This side has not been covered with aluminum.

The first floor pharmacy interior has been thoroughly remodeled and refitted with modern materials. According to the present owners, a part of the old soda fountain was removed and found to have an inscription of 1889. A centrally placed stair formerly rose in the center of the building.

The second floor has not been altered and retains its five-room plan disposed around a center hall. The walls are plastered, and sawn lath are fastened with cut nails. Remaining on the second floor are several grained four-panel doors with grained surrounds. An enclosed stair rises to the finished attic which is divided into three rooms. Unpainted four-panel doors open into each room. These rooms are plastered as well.

Eventually, all of the tracts west of St. Michaels: parts of "Chance", "Taylor and Jane's Discovery", "Elliott's Lot", "Crooked Intention", and part of "Stopper" west of the main road which became Harrison property were called "Canton Farm" by Samuel Harrison after 1802. Harrison evidently did not savor "Crooked Intention".

In 1843, Samuel A Harrison began leasing and selling a strip of numbered lots along Talbot Street (at this time not within the town limits) between Canton Lane and Church Neck Road which was called "Canton Field", later "Canton Row". A plat dated Oct. 2, 1856, "traced from original drawings furnished by Col. Oswald Tilghman" is on record at the Court House (/37)




