The Essich-Embury House (CARR-1703) is located at 58 Old Bachman's Valley Road. This two-and-one-half-story Queen Anne style house was built in 1910. The house rests on a solid stone foundation that is covered in stucco. The exterior walls of the house are clad in brick laid in common bond, and the side-gabled roof is covered in composition shingles. A one-story, wrap-around porch supported by wooden columns on square bases spans the south and west elevations of the house. A brick chimney is located at each interior end of the roof and a Queen Anne style tower is located on the west elevation. The windows are one-over-one aluminum sash with a brick arch over each window. The east elevation of the house features a one-bay entry with a simple door surround and modern wooden porch. Northeast of the house is a two-bay garage that is clad in drop siding and displays a gabled roof covered in composition shingles. An addition clad in T-111 siding has been appended to the west elevation of the garage.

This dwelling exhibits a design common for the period. This resource has no apparent association with any event or person significant in our nation's history, lacks architectural significance, and does not appear to have the ability to yield important information. The Essich-Embury house is recommended as not eligible for the NRHP under Criteria A, B, C, or D.



This two-and-one-half-story Queen Anne style house was built in 1910. The house rests on a solid stone foundation that is covered in stucco. The exterior walls of the house are clad in brick laid in common bond, and the side-gabled roof is covered in composition shingles. A one-story, wrap-around porch supported by wooden columns on square bases spans the south and west elevations of the house. A brick chimney is located at each interior end of the roof and a Queen Anne style tower is located on the west elevation. The windows are one-over-one aluminum sash with a brick arch over each window. The east elevation of the house features a one-bay entry with a simple door surround and modern wooden porch. Northeast of the house is a two-bay garage that is clad in drop siding and displays a gabled roof covered in composition shingles. An addition clad in T-111 siding has been appended to the west elevation of the garage.

The resource was built during the Industrial/Urban Dominance to Modern Period (1870-Present). This dwelling exhibits a design common for the period. This resource has no apparent association with any event or person significant in our nation's history, lacks architectural significance, and does not appear to have the ability to yield important information. The Essich-Embury house is recommended as not eligible for the NRHP under Criteria A, B, C, or D.
