A dominant fixture on the level farm fields northeast of Powellville is the Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church, which occupies a high sandy knoll that is distinctly higher than the surrounding fields. The church occupies the highest point on the knoll along with a nineteenth- and twentieth-century cemetery. Dating to the early twentieth century, the church was built in a traditional manner with a single-story, three-bay sanctuary fronted by a two-story entrance and bell tower. Colored glass memorial windows light the interior.

A Methodist congregation has been located on this site since the third quarter of the nineteenth century. A church is designated on this spot in the Pittsburg District map of the Lake, Griffing, and Stevenson atlas, printed in 1877. Before unification during the mid twentieth century, the Mt. Pleasant membership was a Methodist Episcopal congregation.

Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church, historically known as the Mt. Pleasant Methodist Episcopal Church, is a single-story gable-front frame building standing on a high sandy knoll on the north side of Mt. Pleasant Church Road northeast of Powellville, Wicomico County, Maryland. The church faces south with the principal gable roof oriented on a north/south axis.

Built around 1910, the single-story, gable-front frame church is supported on a stretcher bond brick foundation, and the exterior is sheathed with vinyl siding. The steeply pitched roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the front of the main block is a two-story entrance and bell tower topped by a tapered spire. Located to the west of the church is a single-story gable-front frame church hall. To the north is a nineteenth- and twentieth-century cemetery.

The south (main) façade is a symmetrical elevation with a center entrance and bell tower flanked by narrow colored glass windows. There is a diamond-shaped colored glass window in the tower, and a modern spire rises from the roof. The edge of the roof is trimmed with an extended eave and returns at the base.

The east side of the church is marked by three colored glass memorial windows. The edge of the roof is finished with a boxed cornice. The west side of the church is partially covered by a single-story, gable roofed frame addition, and the addition features several colored glass windows.

To the north is a gable roofed apse, and around round, colored glass window pierces the rear gable. There are narrow colored glass windows on each side.

The interior was not seen.
