Public worship

One of the few historic structures to define the former crossroads community of Wango is a single-story, gable front frame church originally known as John Wesley Methodist Episcopal Church. The single-story frame structure was erected in 1915 following a fire that destroyed the nineteenth-century church on the site. True to the Gothic Revival still in vogue, the most gable roofed frame church was erected with pointed arch, colored glass windows.

The John Wesley Methodist Episcopal congregation was established in 1887, and the denomination remained the same until 1968. The congregation erected the 1915 church during the pastorate of Reverend Essell P. Thomas according to E. C. Hallman's, *The Garden of Methodism*, printed in 1948. Between 1968 and 1988 the congregation shifted to the Wango Wesleyan Church, a Pilgrim Holiness denomination. Since 1988 the congregation has gone by the name, The Carpenter's Church.

The John Wesley Methodist Episcopal Church, also known as the Wango Wesleyan Church and currently, The Carpenter's Church stands at 33524 Wango Road just west of the intersection of Wango and Waste Gate roads, southwest of Powellville, Wicomico County, Maryland. The single-story, gable-front frame church faces south with the gable roof oriented on a north/south axis. Joining the church on the property is a nineteenth and twentieth-century cemetery.

Built in 1915, the single-story, gable-front frame church is supported on a stretcher bond brick foundation, and the exterior is clad with vinyl siding. A medium pitched gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to each side of the 1915 are single story additions.

The south (main) elevation is an asymmetrical front with a gable roofed vestibule covering the left (western) bay, while a tripartite window of colored glass occupies the right (eastern) bay. Piercing the gable end of the vestibule is a pointed arch colored glass window above modern double doors. A half round vent pierces the main gable. Trimming the edge of the roof is an extended eave with an open soffit.

The east and west sides of the church are largely alike with pointed arch colored glass windows lighting the sanctuary. Single flue brick stove chimney rise through each side. Attached to each side and covering the northern bays are single-story gable roofed additions. The edge of the roof is defined by a series of exposed rafter tails.

The north gable end is covered by a shed roofed addition.

The interior has been remodeled but it retains a pressed metal ceiling.


