The Hurley House, located at 11704 Fenno Road, Upper Marlboro, Prince George's County, MD is not located in an historic district nor is it considered eligible for individual listing on the Maryland Register of Historic Places.

The Hurley House is a two and one-half story house built in the early twentieth century. The frame and weatherboard structure sits upon a concrete block base and is covered by a low hipped roof with a hipped-roof dormer in the center of the elevation. The windows are grouped in pairs on the second floor and are single on the first and have 1/1 sashes.

The dwelling is typical of the domestic architecture of the period and lacks the architectural distinctiveness to qualify for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C. The property is not known to have any associations with persons or events significant to our past and is thus not eligible under Criteria A or B.




