

The Shreve House, 5620 Hutton Road (MD 39), is located on the east side of the Highway. The single story, stone, gable-front-roofed dwelling has a three-bay-wide facade, an interior brick chimney stack and a stone foundation wall.

The Shreve House erected in the mid-to-late 1930's according to the adjacent owner, is associated with settlement expansion patterns in outlying areas beyond the town of Oakland limits. This house is typical of vernacular architecture constructed before the advent of World War II.

The Shreve House, 5620 Hutton Road (MD 39), is located on the east side of the highway. Sited perpendicular to the road, the main block is rectangle-shaped. The property is bounded on the north and the south by adjacent houses, on the east by a treeline and on the west or facade by a gravel drive which runs parallel to the highway. Two very tall pine trees are in proximity to the southeast elevation which is nearly twenty feet from the edge of pavement.

The single story, stone, gable-front-roofed dwelling has a three bay wide facade, an interior brick chimney stack and a stone foundation wall. A full width, double pile, frame single story addition is appended to the east wall. This wing has an asphalt shingle covered gable roof. With the exception of the rear wall which is covered with tar paper and has horizontal wood siding in the gable end, the other two elevations are sheathed with asphalt shingle siding in a PermaStone pattern. Attached to the southeast corner is a modern, single story, wood frame, gable-roofed extension with a concrete block chimney stack. Its foundation was not visible; however, the earlier addition's foundation is comprised of concrete block piers and concrete block and brick infill.

All of the windows are single pane, double hung sash units surrounded by wood trim. The symmetrical front door is a single leaf vertical panelled unit with no lights. The one story, gable front porch is three bays wide with square wood posts, exposed rafter tails, and rests upon a dry laid stone foundation.

The Shreve House erected in the mid-to-late 1930's according to the adjacent property owner, is associated with settlement expansion patterns in outlying areas beyond the town of Oakland's limits. New and improved roads fostered residential growth along adjacent and unusable farmlands. Hutton Road, the road to Crellin, was realigned in the mid 1930's. This house is typical of vernacular residential architecture constructed before the advent of World War II.






Resource Sketch Map
