The Edgar Duplex is located at the west end of MD 39 at 5459-5461 Hutton Road. Built into a downward sloping hill, the house is a one story, hipped roof wood frame domicile with wide roof eaves, an exterior brick chimney stack, and a four bay front porch. The structure exhibits bilateral symmetry in its structure and detail.

The dwelling was erected in 1940 as part of an expansion of settlement into areas beyond the town limits of Oakland. The Edgar Duplex was part of a community known as Hungry Hollow, so named because of its reputation as a haven for low-income workers and their families. The house is a typical example of mid-twentieth century domestic architecture, but is the only multiple residence encountered in the survey area.

The Edgar duplex is located on the west of MD 39 at 5459-5461 Hutton Road. Built into a downward sloping hill, the property is bounded on the north and south elevations by undivided space while the western edge is demarcated by a scruffy tree line and part of the eastern side is delineated by a hedgerow. The dwelling sits approximately twelve feet away from Hutton Road, perpendicular to the highway, and is rectangle-shaped. Only on the south side of the house is a gravel driveway detected.

The one story, wood frame, hipped roof domicile has wide roof eaves, an exterior brick chimney stack, and a four bay front porch. Each half of the building is like a mirror image of itself; the fenestration on each elevation has been duplicated. For example, there are two, single bay side entrances. A full width, hipped roof front porch is attached to the facade. At the center post, a frame half wall divides the porch into separate living areas. With the exception of the half enclosed side entry on the south elevation which is sheathed with asbestos shingle siding, the exterior walls are covered with Bricktex siding. A concrete block foundation has two rear entrances and a two light casement windows in the north and south walls.

All of the windows are 6/6 light double hung sash units while the two facade doors are single leaf units with multiple glass lights and wood trim. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The Edgar Duplex, erected in 1940 according to county tax records, relates to the expanded settlement of areas located beyond the town limits of Oakland. Characterized by development along new and existing roads, this community known locally as Hungry Hollow became a haven low-income workers and their families. Although this is the only multiple residence encountered in the survey area, it is a typical example of mid-twentieth century domestic architecture.



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
